Higher scores are “worse” for moral injury but lower scores are “worse” for wellbeing/connectedness

Red type and * denotes scores for significantly worse than respondents outside that sector and green or ** significantly better (where $p<0.05$ using the Mann-Whitney test).

Before comparing individual sectors, the difference in scores across all employment sectors was investigated using the Kruskal-Wallis test (see first column).
